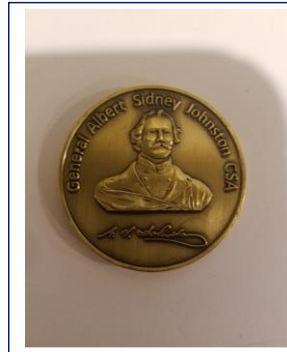


## SAVE THE DATE!!!
