## Hometown Heroes

### Captain J. E. Floyd

Marshall Messenger Friday July 22, 1910:

Captain J. E. Floyd died Sunday evening (July 17, 1910) and his funeral was held Monday Evening at 5 o'clock from St. Joseph's Catholic Church. Interment was held in the Marshall Cemetery beside the body of his 1<sup>st</sup> wife. Captain Floyd was an old resident of Marshall, having come here with the Texas & Pacific shops when they were moved here in the 1870's. He was born in Fort Gaines, GA. December 21, 1829. During the War Between the States he was Captain of Company I, 31<sup>st</sup> Georgia Regiment, Artillery Unit.

He leaves as children Louis H and Will Floyd, Mrs. Hamilton, Mrs. Ricks, Mrs. Young, Mrs. Ketcham, Miss Lillie Floyd and a widow. Confederate Veterans will attend the funeral, meeting at the house and escorting the remains to the Church and the grave. Captain Floyd was a member of the United Confederate Veterans Camp 621, Marshall.

### How Do I Join The Sons of Confederate Veterans?

The SCV is the direct heir of the United Confederate Veterans. Organized at Richmond, Virginia in 1896, the SCV continues to serve as a historical, patriotic, and non-political organization dedicated to ensuring that a true history of the 1861-1865 period is preserved. Membership in the Sons of Confederate Veterans is open to all male descendants of any veteran who served honorably in the Confederate armed forces. Membership can be obtained through either lineal or collateral family lines and kinship to a veteran must be documented genealogically. The minimum age for full membership is 12, but there is no minimum for Cadet Membership.
