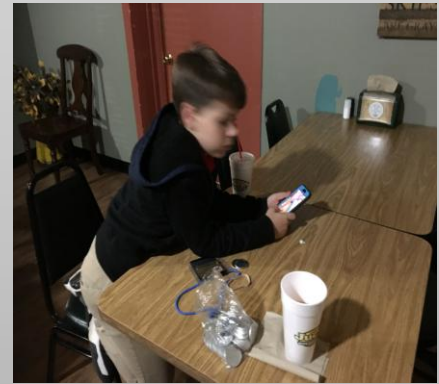
Compatriots:

Heartsill's Camp February Meeting



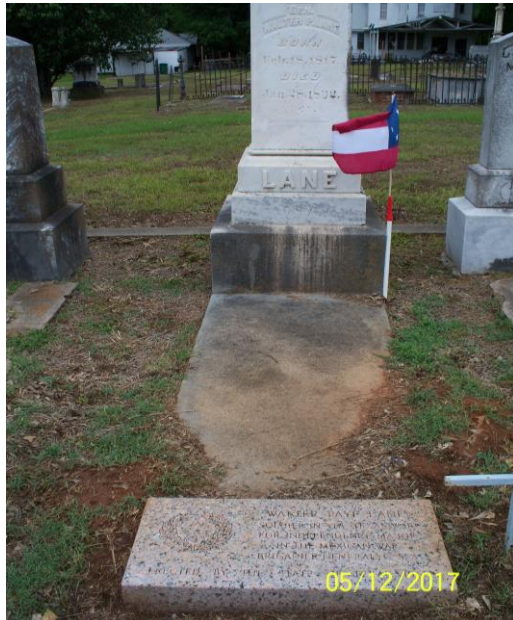

I have sharing information and working with the Chairman of the Harrison County Historical Commission. They have found this 1936 plaque place in storage. I have offered our help in mounting it at Gen. Lane's gravesite.

Call To Action: Again. We must do our part.

Compatriots I have found 2 more Bills that have been filed to protect our Monuments. Senate Bill SB 1663 by Senator Creighton and its companion Bill HB 3948 by Rep. Toth were filed in the 1st week of March. **It is time for our elected Officials to protect our heritage.**

House Bill 583 by Representative James White from Woodville along with **Senate Bill 226 by Senator Pat Fallon from Prosper** both offer protection of monuments erected to honor Veterans on City, County or State property. I will include copies of these Bills for you to study and understand these Bills. I ask that you then call, write or email your Senator or Representative.

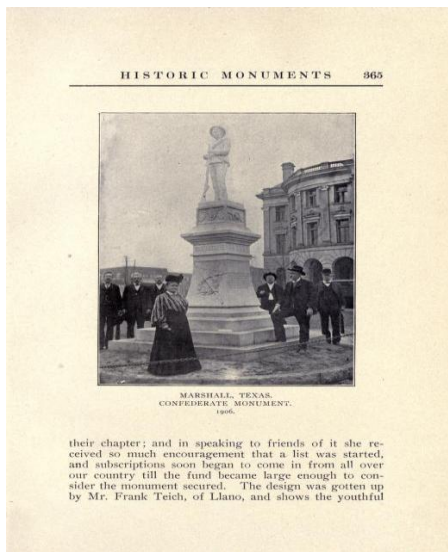

How Do I Join The Sons of Confederate Veterans?

The SCV is the direct heir of the United Confederate Veterans. Organized at Richmond, Virginia in 1896, the SCV continues to serve as a historical, patriotic, and non-political organization dedicated to ensuring that a true history of the 1861-1865 period is preserved. Membership in the Sons of Confederate Veterans is open to all male descendants of any veteran who served honorably in the Confederate armed forces. Membership can be obtained through either lineal or collateral family lines and kinship to a veteran must be documented genealogically. The minimum age for full membership is 12, but there is no minimum for Cadet membership.
