



BG/ Col. F.S. Bass, CO. E. 1st Texas

Gen. Albert Sidney Johnston

I had the honor to visit the grave of BG F.S. Bass commander of the 1st Texas Inf. at the surrender at Appomattox. Bass was the Captain of Co. E, 1st Texas "Marshall Guards" and was President of Marshall University before the War and returned to his job after the War. He is buried between Gen William Read Scurry and Gen. Benjamin McCulloch. Lt. Gov. Bob Bulloch is behind him and Stephen F Austin is 15 feet in front of Gen. Bass. Compared to the huge tombstones around him all he has is this 24 by 24 marker that has Col. T. S. Bass not BG F. S. Bass. If there is ever a man more deserving of a better marker it is Fredrick Samuel Bass. I was honored to place a flag and flowers on his grave to remember him but had to remove them due to WOKE cemetery people not allowing such items. There are over 2000 Confederate soldiers and their wives buried at the Texas State Cemetery



The Confederate Woman's home was opened in 1903 at W. 38th @ Cedar St in Austin. In 1908 a new home was built and later a Hospital was built and opened to care for the Widows of Confederate Veterans. It closed in 1963 after the last widow died. I was acquired by the AGE of Central Texas a program to help the elderly with all kinds of care which are subsidized by tax dollars. They did not like the Historical marker in the yard of this building so they covered it with black trash bags and the fight began. The Capital City Chapter of the Descendants of Confederate Veteran along with the Texas UDC successfully fought this group before the Texas Historical Commission during the begging of COVID. All hearing were conducted on ZOOM and it was brought to light that AGE in secret emails to their Board wanted to remove the marker and tear the build down. After losing to the Commission they placed this green sign to show what a bunch of WOKE had to cry about being told NO. Great job DCV and UDC,



How Do I Join The Sons of Confederate Veterans?

The SCV is the direct heir of the United Confederate Veterans. Organized at Richmond, Virginia in 1896, the SCV continues to serve as a historical, patriotic, and non-political organization dedicated to ensuring that a true history of the 1861-1865 period is preserved. Membership in the Sons of Confederate Veterans is open to all male descendants of any veteran who served honorably in the Confederate armed forces. Membership can be obtained through either lineal or collateral family lines and kinship to a veteran must be documented genealogically. The minimum age for full membership is 12, but there is no minimum for Cadet Membership.
