April Confederate Heritage Month

I would like to share with you how the Month of April 1861 was of major importance to Harrison County. To do this I would like to share with you some information from our Camp's namesake Ord. Sgt. W. W. Heartsill's book "Fourteen Hundred and 91 Days in the Confederate Army"

April 1st 1861 Sheriff A. W. Crawford received authority from the Governor Edward Clark to raise one Company from Harrison and adjourning counties, with instructions to give neighboring counties fair opportunity to furnish their quota. Sheriff Crawford immediately opened a book for the registration of names. On April 7th Heartsill signed up. By April 10th the list was full to overflowing. Sheriff Crawford appointed April 19th as the day for the organization of the Company. Heartsill states "On this day my journal of the Company begins, and to when, or how it will end; the Great "I AM," alone knoweth. "Believing that our cause is just; a strict sense of duty has impelled me to the course I have pursued in enlisting, as military fame I do not desire.

April 19th, 1861. At an early hour the hitherto quiet, of Marshall is disturbed by the "Neigh of the war horse" an assembling of the Cavalry. The counties of Panola, Upshur, and Marion have sent forth some of their best material; and the town is full of soldiers, all finely mounted and equipped for service. At 9 o'clock we fall into line on the north side of the Courthouse, and prepare for valuation of horses which is conducted by Maj. Wm Bradfield, A. G. Scogin and Sheriff A. W. Crawford this takes most of the day. At 3 o'clock we proceed to the organization of the Company. Balloting begins for the election of our Officers and after the count the Company was called together in the front of the Courthouse and the oath administered by Judge Frazier; after which, on motion of a member of the Company, (Captain Sam J. Richardson) which was unanimously and enthusiastically adopted: that the name of the Company shall be the "W. P. Lane Rangers" in honor of a worthy citizen of Marshall. A total of 92 men and Officers are now ready and willing to serve our Cause.

Pleasant have also signed on to this Bill. The hearing did happen. From what I read there were 26 public in attendance for the Bill and 10 against. The against were from Coty of San Antonio, City of Dallas, City of Austin and Harris CO. Commissioners Court. These are ones not stopping this removal foolishness. 583 was left pending without objection ?????

I also got a notice from the TX Div. that a hearing on SB 1663 would be held on April 10th. The meeting was cancelled but rescheduled on April 11th. I can not find out if that meeting happened or not. It is time for our elected Officials to protect our heritage.

How Do I Join The Sons of Confederate Veterans?

The SCV is the direct heir of the United Confederate Veterans. Organized at Richmond, Virginia in 1896, the SCV continues to serve as a historical, patriotic, and non-political organization dedicated to ensuring that a true history of the 1861-1865 period is preserved. Membership in the Sons of Confederate Veterans is open to all male descendants of any veteran who served honorably in the Confederate armed forces. Membership can be obtained through either lineal or collateral family lines and kinship to a veteran must be documented genealogically. The minimum age for full membership is 12, but there is no minimum for Cadet membership.
