Merry Christmas to all,

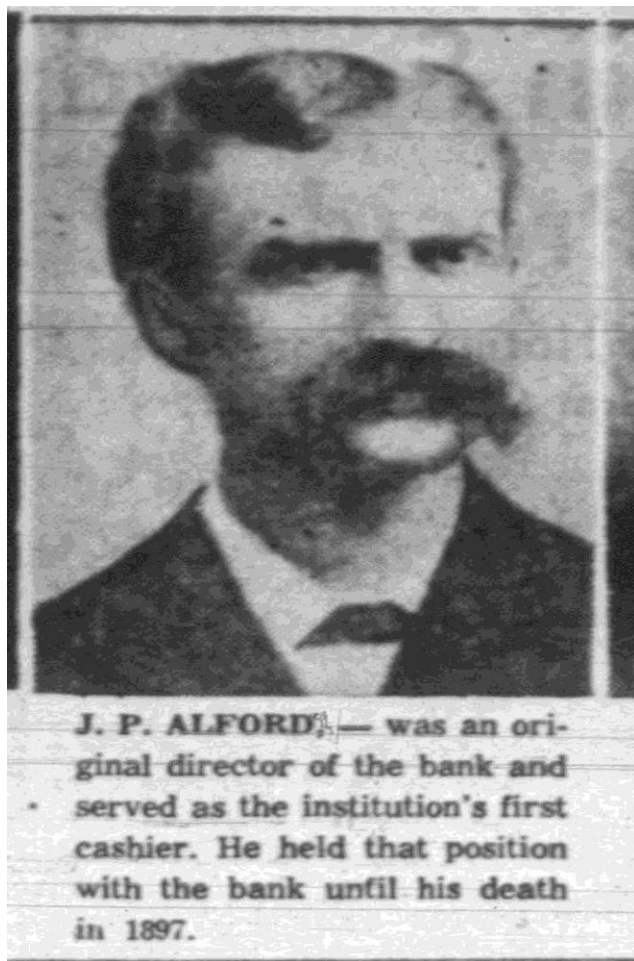

Josiah Perry Alford: 10/26/1843 to 10/7/1897

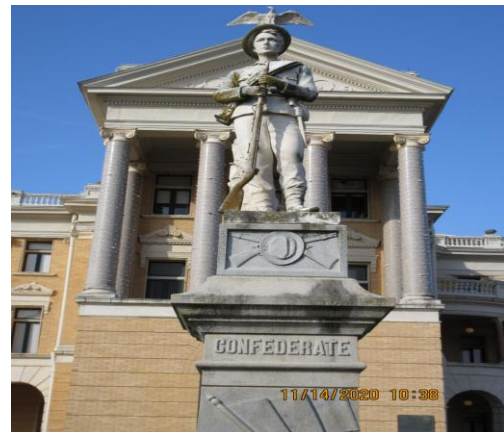
Co. D., 7th Texas Inf. Reg. “Bass Greys” Capt. K.M. Van Zandt



Marshall National Bank 1890-1897

J.P. Alford served as Harrison County Clerk from 1867 to 1890. He was removed as County Clerk during the Reconstruction Years and replaced by action of the Republican County Judge at the time for being a Confederate Veteran. With the power play by the Citizens Party he was reelected and returned to the County Clerk's position in 1880. He served the CO. D., 7th ^{TX}. Inf. Reg., from 1861 to 1863 when he lost his leg in the Battle of Chickamauga and was medically discharged. He was born in the Jonesville area of Harrison County and is buried in

our Greenwood Cemetery. His obituary was in the Shreveport, Fort Worth and St. Louis papers.

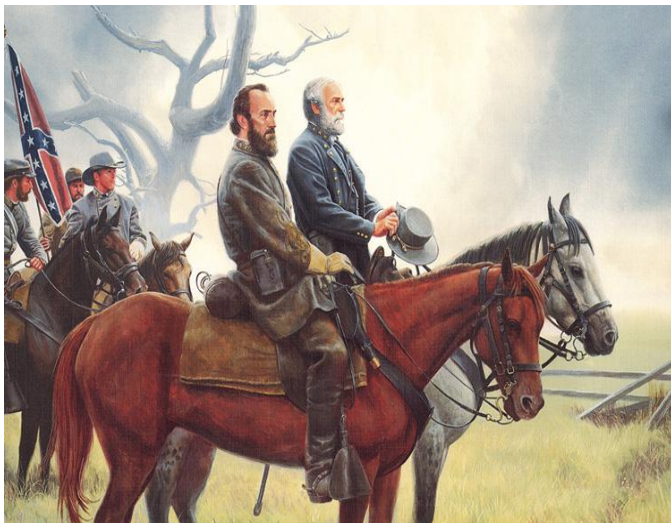

How Do I Join The Sons of Confederate Veterans?

The SCV is the direct heir of the United Confederate Veterans. Organized at Richmond, Virginia in 1896, the SCV continues to serve as a historical, patriotic, and non-political organization dedicated to ensuring that a true history of the 1861-1865 period is preserved. Membership in the Sons of Confederate Veterans is open to all male descendants of any veteran who served honorably in the Confederate armed forces. Membership can be obtained through either lineal or collateral family lines and kinship to a veteran must be documented genealogically. The minimum age for full membership is 12, but there is no minimum for Cadet Membership.
